





he official opening of ACA Kwai Chung 🚣 Centre was on 4 November 2016. This is a good development of ACA as the centre facilitates access for service users and it enables different variety of services to be delivered. On the same day, over 100 professionals from various disciplines participated in ACA's Annual Forum to focus on the issue of Legislation Provision in Child Protection in Hong Kong. ACA aspires to organising such successful events because multi-disciplinary collaboration is the key to success in child protection.

Our work achievements over the past year have been announced in the Press Conference and in our 37th AGM on 7 November 2016. Again, we emphasised our closely connected roles in prevention, child protection, therapy and advocacy. Child emotional abuse and neglect is largely not talked about in Hong Kong but it results in dire consequences. We emphasised for it be dealt with vigour.

The importance of Children's Rights was promulgated in the Asia Pacific International Schools Conference on 9-10 November 2016. We also made submissions and spoke in the Subcommittee on Children's Rights of the Welfare Panel, Legislative Council on the "Support Service for Families with Children under Care of Drug Abusing Parents" on 22 December 2016. Further, upon the invitation by Save the Children Hong Kong, ACA and HKCCR jointly led a delegation to study the subject of Children's Rights in the Bhutan Children's Parliament from 25 December 2016 to 4 January 2017.

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On 17 December 2016, in the agency's annual retreat, we reviewed our past year's achievement. Thanks to the dedication of staff, annual objectives had been achieved. Year 2017 marks the commencement of ACA's another 3-year plan. We will continue with high spirits in our mission.

Not long ago a 14-year-old boy fell prey to a sex predator over the internet. In fact, this sex offender had been convicted and incarcerated before, thrice. This is most emotionally arousing but nothing seems to have been learnt by the society to better tackle the problem. And not before long, another tragic incident will strike again. The child protection system is not doing its job well. A statutory independent body to take charge of child issues has been on ACA's advocacy agenda. This is echoed in a 2016 Christmas South China Morning Post feature article on cyber safety authored by Mr Grenville Cross, SBS, QC, SC, ACA's CPI

consultant - that we are in dire straits for such an independent body. The Legislative Council's motion for a Children Commission was passed but Hong Kong is yet to see this materialised.

As the year of the rooster has ushered in hope, we look forward to a year's challenge ahead. Major activities of ACA include Spank Out Day on 30 April 2017, Flag Day on 20 May 2017, Volunteer Award Ceremony in mid-2017, Professional Forum and Press Conference towards the year end. We must thank all who have supported ACA unfailingly through the years. We appeal again for your continual support. Get in touch with us. Let us all work together for a peaceful society for our children to grow and mature. Best wishes.

She has a 4-year-old child with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder to look after. She has to face all sorts of stress in her everyday life. The Daylily Project provided her with regular volunteer home visitation, different parent education programmes and emotional support, as well as parent-child activities for her to learn positive parenting skills. She expressed her gratitude for the support and encouragement from ACA's social workers and volunteers.

The Annual Press Conference was followed by the 37th Annual General Meeting cum Annual Dinner.

We were honoured to have Professor Ian Grenville Cross, SBS, QC, SC, and Mrs Cross; Mr Chua Hoi Wai, Chief Executive of HKCSS; Mr Paul Liu, Honorary Legal Advisor of ACA and Ms Wanda Vong, Chairperson of ACAM as guests.

Child Abuse Treatment Corner

The Child Abuse Treatment Corner organised a Batterer Intervention Therapeutic Group for parents from September to November 2016. The group applied Cognitive Behavioural Therapy by using positive parenting approaches on their children. By so-doing, it was hoped that parents would stop using corporal punishment and would learn to practise positive thinking. The following was the feedback from one of our group members:

Dear Ms Cheng and Ms Wong,

28th October 2016



Hello! I am pleased to join the group "Child Abuse Treatment Corner". The group helped me understand the importance of the parents' emotion in parenting and taught me how to adjust my emotion in order to guide and discipline my children in a better way.

Before joining the group, I always lost my temper when I tried to discipline my children. My uncontrollable emotion would inevitably lead to violent behaviours. I understand that parents are children's role models and first teachers. I could see how my uncontrollable emotions affected my children. Our relationship was not harmonious. I felt worried and nervous and at times I almost

collapsed. I loved my children and so I always changed my parenting methods, hoping that they would help to change our relationship for the better. However, they never did. During the group sessions, I learnt from you and other parents. These sessions made me realise the importance of having good control of one's emotions. I recognised that maybe I was the one who needed to be educated. After joining the group, I started to have better control my emotion and I did not easily lose my temper like before. I also noticed that whenever I had changes on my parenting approaches, my children changed as well. I am still trying my best to find ways to get along with my children. This is not going to be easy but I am so happy to see the changes in us.

I would like to thank you sincerely for your lectures and help. I am very touched. If I had not joined the group, I would not have understood how my emotions affected my children. Once again, thank you!

Sharing Forum on Child Protection Legislation in Hong Kong cum ACA Kwai Chung Centre Opening Ceremony

A CA has a new page in 2016. Our Kwai Chung Centre started its service in June 2016. Our services to the district have received many good responses and so far the participants have found our activities both useful and enjoying. On 4 November 2016, we had an opening ceremony for ACA Kwai Chung Centre. We were glad to have invited Mr Alex Wong, the District Social Welfare Officer (Tsuen Wan and Kwai Tsing) of Social Welfare Department, to be our officiating guest. Mr Wong together with ACA Executive Committee members held the opening ceremony. The atmosphere was good and there were over a hundred participants joining the ceremony.



After the opening ceremony, a sharing forum on Child Protection Legislation in Hong Kong was held. Dr Patrick Cheung, our Chairperson, acted as the moderator of the forum. Guest speakers included the Hon Madam Justice Esther Toh, Judge of the Court of First Instance of the High Court, HKSAR; Professor Ian Grenville Cross, SBS, QC, SC, Vice-Chairman of Senate of the International Association of Prosecutors; Ms Frances Lee, CIP (Family Conflict and Sexual Violence Policy Unit)(Crime Wing), Hong Kong Police Force; Associate Professor Amanda Whitfort, Chairperson of Causing or Allowing the Death of a Child, Subcommittee of the Law Reform Commission of Hong Kong; Mr Azan Marwah, Barrister-at-Law, Gilt Chambers; and Dr Shiu Yiu Keung, Paediatrician, Professional Development Committee member, Against Child Abuse.

During the forum, all guest speakers shared their expertise on how to collaborate with multi-discipline professionals in child protection work. They also shared their views on how to improve child protection in Hong Kong. It was also stressed that early intervention is very important for children's protection. Taking into consideration of "the best interests of the child" was the important part in the child protection work.

The party provided them a chance to broaden their horizon and gave them warmth.

Good Parents' Networking Project

Parent's Relaxing Zone


From October to December 2016, we held regular parent activities, such as Morning Tea Sharing and Parent's Kitchen and Handcraft workshops. These activities enabled participants to share information and experience with each other and enrich themselves. We hope that the building up of mutual support groups can increase their sense of belonging.

Good Parents' Networking Training Course

In October 2016, we held the third stage of the "Good Parents' Networking" training course. Parents were encouraged to share the knowledge and skills they learnt in stages 1 and 2, to conduct a sharing session and a cooking class in order to benefit more parents and build a community mutual aid network.

Holiday Farm Family Gathering

A parent-child outing was arranged on 27 November 2016 at Sheung Shui Holiday Farm. There were 73 participants, including 41 parents and 32 children. Parents and children enjoyed the outing activities, such as D.I.Y. bread making, feeding and interacting with animals, finishing the game tasks, playing in a playground made from recycled materials. Families revealed that they had lots of fun and enjoyed the quality family time together. The outing helped to increase the parent-child relationship.









Good Parents Sharing Time

In order to help parents enhance their skills and knowledge in parenting and to establish a support network, an 8-session "Good Parents Sharing Time" course was held from 3 November 2016 to 5 January 2017 in our Tuen Mun Centre. Child developmental needs, skills in handling children's emotional problems, listening skills and skills in conflict resolution were shared.

One of the characteristics in this course was that the volunteers from the Family Corner Volunteer Group were the host and also the speaker for the programme. It equipped the volunteers with better presentation and organisation skills, and also enhanced the cohesiveness among the parents. The participants reflected that mutual support relationship was built up and their parenting skills had improved a lot through the group discussions, role play and experience-sharing sessions. In short, 24 parents participated in the course. 13 of them will join the Family Corner Volunteer Group to help support ACA in promoting child protection services.

The Chuk Yuen Centre Family Corner

We held the "Good Parents' Leadership" Training Group (Stage 2) in October and December 2016. It aimed at raising participants' awareness of child protection and building up their confidence in providing services. The ten graduate parents would assist parent education programmes in Chuk Yuen Family Corner in future.

On 25 October and 12 December 2016, we held a hiking activity in Clear Water Bay Country Park and a "Dessert DIY" parent class to make butterfly crackers and almond bars respectively. The participants enjoyed leisure corner activities and thought it helped them relieve their life pressure and gave them the opportunity to make new friends.

On New Year's Day of 2017, the families went to an organic farm in Kam Sheung Road. They enjoyed the parent-child drama show and BBQ party. The occasion was an unforgettable experience for them.

In the new year, I will start my service in Tuen Mun Centre. I would like to thank all those I worked with in Chuk Yuen Centre for the past three years. I am sure Chuk Yuen Family Corner will continue its parent support network for families in the district.

Child Protection and Treatment Project - Happy Child Starting from the Home

Sponsored by Help for Children Asia Prevent and Treat Child Abuse



This project aims at helping children to learn ways to tackle emotions, express their feelings and thoughts and regain confidence; helping parents to understand their children's developmental needs, and learn skills in positive parenting and stress management; and improving parent-child relationships.

From October to December 2016, we organised two "Happy Parenting Education Activities" for 41 parents; and one "Expressive Art Therapy Training" workshop for 55 children. In this period, a total of ninie free-of-charge play sessions were offered to children under 12 years old.

On 13 December 2016, Dr Patricia Ip, ACA Executive Committee member; Ms Wanda Hau, Assistant Director; the project social worker and two mothers, shared with the representatives and advisers of the funder about our services. On the same day, we also held a Christmas party.
